

Invasive herbaceous species list 2010

The majority of exotic species found in Canada are European and Eurasian in origin. Many of these species share the same characteristics, such as rapid growth in a variety of conditions, abundant seed production, highly successful seed dispersal, germination, and colonization, the ability to propagate vegetatively, a lack of pests or pathogens acting as natural controls, the ability to out-compete native species, and a high cost to remove and control.

The following table lists the invasive risk for several potentially invasive plants found in Oakville. Developed by the Canadian Botanical Conservation Network.
