









To help support economic growth and intensification, Halton Region is phasing out the Vacant Unit Tax Rebate Program currently administered by its Local Municipalities.

## Background

In February 2017, the Region explored program changes in accordance with the *Municipal Act*, *2001*, section 364. Staff engaged the Municipal Treasurers, Halton Economic Development Partnership and local Business Improvement Area representatives. These discussions identified that a phase-out would reflect resident priorities and support Provincial growth targets by:

- fostering site redevelopment;
- reducing vacancies and derelict buildings;
- encouraging landlords to enhance properties; and
- · promoting equality amongst taxpayers.

The phase-out plan was approved by Regional Council (FN-11-17) and the Ontario Ministry of Finance.

## Phase-out schedule

The program will remain unchanged for 2017 property taxes—the phase-out will occur in 2018 and 2019 to help mitigate its impact on local businesses.
