Officiant Preamble, welcome and introduction
THE PURPOSE

## Officiant to 2nd person:

"I call upon these persons here present to witness that $I$, $\qquad$ do take you,
$\qquad$ to be my lawful wedded (wife/husband/partner)"

Please place this ring on the third finger of $\qquad$ 's left hand saying after me:
