- Other topics such as (but not limited to) emerging program needs, climate change impacts, digital services, pricing and affordability, park and trail design, physical literacy, etc.

The Master Plan will be evidence-based, grounded in:




Demographic analysis – how and where Oakville is growing, changes in age, ethnicity, income, etc.

Ongoing Projects & Recent Accomplishments

Past master plans have supported several significant projects completed by the town in recent years, including (but not limited to):

- ☐ The Trafalgar Park Community Centre opened in 2018, followed by the award-winning Oakville Trafalgar Community Centre in 2020
- The community park at **Sixteen Mile Sports Complex** is anticipated to open in late 2023 and the community centre and library will open in 2025
- ☐ The **Downtown Cultural Hub** initiative is planning for a revitalized library and cultural facilities throughout the downtown area
- ☐ The town purchased **44-hectares of land** (former Fogolars Country Club) for passive parkland and educational opportunities
- ☐ New parks and village squares have been developed throughout the town, including North Oakville
- ☐ Various **improvements** have also been made to facilities and parks throughout Oakville
- ☐ Improved access to **technology and online services**




Population & Growth

Parks, recreation and library facilities are used by residents of all ages and backgrounds

- □ Oakville's current population of 225,000 is projected to grow to 373,990 residents by 2051 nearly 70% growth over the next 30 years
- ☐ The town is committed to meeting its housing pledge of 33,000 new residential units by 2031/32
- Much of the town's growth will occur in North Oakville and in growth areas such as Midtown Oakville, Uptown Core, Palermo Village, Kerr Village, Bronte Village, and Downtown Oakville






Age, Income & Diversity

Oakville's population is changing

- ☐ The town's population is aging (median age of 41.6 years), although many new families are also moving to Oakville
- Income levels in Oakville households are higher than the region and province; however, 9% are considered low-income and may have greater difficulty accessing some recreation services as a result
- Many new residents are also newcomers 41% of
 Oakville residents were born outside of Canada and
 19% speak a non-official language most often at home






