Sixteen Mile Sports Complex is expanding, and we're putting on the finishing touches to open Oakville's newest community hub in 2026. The new community centre and library will include pools, active and creative spaces, expanded sports fields, courts, and more.

Construction begins on a new Central Library downtown at Church Street, and land will be secured for a Trafalgar Urban Core South Community Centre to serve our fastest-growing area.

By year's end, 50 per cent of Oakville Transit's fleet will be electric, cutting emissions and modernizing service. We are maintaining housing targets each year, and as Halton's largest municipality, we have kept the 2026 budget increase to 1.96 per cent.

Together, we are living our Livable Oakville Plan.

Government

Levels of government

The Town of Oakville is your local government, also known as municipal government. In Canada we have federal, provincial, regional, and municipal levels of government. Each level has distinct responsibilities, and they often work together.

Federal

The Government of Canada is responsible for national defense and Canadian Armed Forces, postal service, banking, employment, citizenship and immigration, census, foreign affairs and international trade, agriculture and more.

Provincial

The Government of Ontario is responsible for health, education, driver and vehicle licensing, energy, human rights, natural resources, environment, social services and more.

Regional

The Region of Halton is responsible for recycling and garbage collection, policing, paramedics, community housing, public health services and more. The region serves residents from the Town of Oakville, City of Burlington, Town of Milton and Halton Hills.

Municipal

The Town of Oakville is your local municipal government and is responsible for parks, libraries, local transit, land use planning, roads, streets, sidewalks, traffic signals, fire services, sewers, recreation and culture programs, and more.

2026 Municipal Election

The municipal election takes place on October 26, 2026 when you elect your local Council, Regional Chair and school board trustees.

- Candidate names will be available after May 1, 2026 on the town website. Find out who is running, read up about them so you can make an informed choice.
- Recruitment for election workers to begin in spring/summer of 2026. Check elections.oakville.ca for details.
- Watch for the voter notice to arrive by mail in late 2026. Don't forget to bring your card and one pieces of ID when you head to your voting location!

Advisory committees and boards

Committee of Adjustment

A committee to make decisions on requests for variances from any of the Town's zoning by-laws.

The Committee of Adjustment (COA) is an independent decision-making group made up of citizens, appointed by Town Council under the authority of the Planning Act of Ontario, to make decisions regarding requests for variances from any of the Town's zoning by-laws. Town Council is not involved in the decision making process or the decision of this committee. The committee meets to consider applications for minor variances from the zoning by-law, applications for land division (consent to sever land), and any other variances specified by council that implement the official plan.

Heritage Oakville Advisory Committee

A committee to review planning and development applications for heritage properties.

The mandate of Heritage Oakville is to advise Council on the identification, conservation and promotion of heritage resources in Oakville. The committee reviews and makes recommendations on planning and development applications for heritage properties including alterations, removal or demolition. The committee also promotes heritage conservation through the support of heritage designations, heritage policy matters and public awareness of Oakville's historical resources. The Heritage Oakville Advisory Committee meets monthly to discuss and make recommendations on heritage matters. The Committee's recommendations are forwarded to the Planning and Development Council for their final consideration and decision.
